

Day 1 | Read Exodus 13:1-16, Exodus 4:22-23, Deuteronomy 32:6, Number 18:14-17, and 1 Peter 1:18-19.

Principle: God commands us to teach our children about all that He did to redeem us, His people.

- 1. Why did God require the Hebrews to *sacrifice* their first-born animals and to *redeem* their first-born sons?
- 2. What price did God pay to redeem you from slavery to the devil and to restore you as His son? How should this impact your affection for God, your purpose and your identity?

Day 2 | Read Exodus 13:17-14:14, Genesis 50:24-26, Genesis 15:12-16, Proverbs 16:9, and Isaiah 55:8-9.
Principle: God faithfully leads his people to the right place at the right time, never failing to keep His promises.
1. What do you learn about the manner in which God leads us as His people when He needs us to move?

2. How has God led you in the past? How might you discern whether God is leading you to a new place or calling you to remain where you are?

Day 3 | Read Exodus 14:15-31, Psalm 106:6-12, Hebrews 11:24-28, Matthew 2:15, and John 5:24. Principle: God judges his enemies and brings salvation to those who fear Him.

- 1. What are all the ways in this Red Sea story in which God saves his people and judges his enemies?
- 2. What does this story reveal about salvation and each man's role in his own salvation?

Day 4 | Read Exodus 15:1-21, Revelation 15:1-4, Psalm 40, and Colossians 3:16.

Principle: Our salvation is a display of God's glory that moves our hearts to praise Him.

- 1. Why do you think the people of Israel sang this song and Moses chose to write it down? What does the song of Moses teach you about God?
- 2. When should you be compelled to sing to God? What causes you to sing about God instead of singing to God?
